Ezra 3:12-13


In Ezekiel 3:16-21 the Lord gives Ezekiel the message describing the risks/rewards for the one whom the Lord calls to deliver warnings of impending doom. "When you see the sword coming" means when there are dire circumstances or damaging events coming upon a people or nation, particularly concerning Israel, then God's messenger must act and speak as directed by the Holy Spirit. The warnings communicated to those who are facing dangerous times, may or may not be heeded, but that is no concern to the messenger. The messenger concentrates on communicating the message as faithfully and truthfully as possible. Otherwise, the messenger faces his/her own consequences.

Thus, I am planning a six-week sermon series, beginning September 15th, and ending October 20th. The title for each segment begins "Preparing for Vote 2024." The outcome of national elections this year could inspire drastic and destructive consequences, regardless of the winner. What sort of witness should we endeavor to portray, if the result garners our favor or disappointment? The world responds like the people described in Ezra 3:12-13. Some will be weeping uncontrollably and others shouting victoriously. Therein lies the problem. In the ensuing noise the Christian has a message of hope and reconciliation. Not only to those of an opposite political persuasion but for a confused and frightened world. Please pray for me as I continue preparing these messages.

Teir 2 ~ \$150 + worth of donations = Listed as sponsor on sign and 2 family general admission passes.




